On the crofting tours, you can learn about Shetland sheep in their native landscape. The factory tour of the Sandness Mill is for anyone interested in the production of yarn.





he renowned man of oo, Oliver Henry will be on hand to share his knowledge at the popular wool sorting and grading demonstrations. The timing of the event means we will miss the annual Flock Book sale, but the Shetland Flock Book Trust will host the Silver Shears Fine Wool competition.

Many communities will open their doors to you, with exhibitions, demonstrations and drop in events where you will be able to mingle with local folk in an informal setting and enjoy sharing skills and yarning about all things Shetland Wool. They will feed you well - did anyone mention tea and fancies?

This year, we appointed a dedicated Curator, Donna Smith. Sharing her extensive knowledge of the wool industry, Donna has helped to shape the content of the programme. The theme of Mak + Do + Mend, reflects the need to care for our planet, and use resources wisely. Shetland Wool is a natural, sustainable product, and some of the activities celebrate the fact that it can be used and re-used, time and time again. Donna will give a talk at the Shetland Wool Week Welcome opening ceremony, where you can mingle, hear from some special guests and enjoy our sponsors' displays.

We will host talks, where you can enjoy hearing the inspirations of local and visiting speakers. A varied cultural programme allows a chance to enjoy Shetland's rich heritage, such as archaeological sites, bog planting, food, drama, music and language.
